Sue McCoy's Report from:

235th Session of the Virginia Annual Conference, United Methodist Church June 16-18, 2017, Hampton, Virginia

Purpose: To make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world by equipping its local churches for ministry and providing a connection for ministry beyond the local church; all to the glory of God. (p. 8-Book of Reports)

Bishop Sharma Lewis presided over her first Virginia Annual Conference. She reported on the information she gleaned through her 32 "Chat and



Chew" sessions in 16 different locations. From those sessions, she has derived a ministry vision for our conference.


Isaiah 43:19 Behold, I am doing a new thing, now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.

· It is time to stop looking backward, to clarify our focus and commit to God's Plan. We are disciples of Jesus Christ. **Bishop Lewis defined a disciple as** *a lifelong learner who influences others to serve.* This gives clarification to our process of making disciples by loving God, loving others, for the transformation of the world.

Some other words of inspiration I heard at conference this year include:

- Change teaches life is fragile, uncertain, and temporary; Psalm 102 "For I the Lord will never change!
- We can't insure success; Take risks and trust in the Lord.
- The key to our victory is at the hands of God.
- ♦ The key to mission is in the hands of the people. God chose 12 of them. He uses us to fulfill his greatness.
- ♦ Allow for Kairos time; God's time. Some moments are more valuable than others. Don't count time as minutes and hours with a to do list; count it as opportunities to be with God and share his word. Watch! Be ready!
- ♦ Shared vision when the leaders of the church share their passion with the congregation in meeting the needs of the community. The intersect of these components is when God speaks.
- Engage our youth and young adults now. Engage them in relevant ministries that make a difference. Establish multigenerational relationships to share experience with a new perspective.

I heard that many of the teachers have to pay out of their own pockets for the extra supplies in the class-room. Not only should we support our teachers in prayer, but we should also encourage them to continue their mission successfully. All donations will be distributed to our teachers during our Back-to-School Open Table on August 30 at 6:30 PM.

My First Prayer To Be Answered—As I remember:

I was not aware of a depression; I was only eight years old but as I look back on it now, this year was in the middle of the lean years of the early thirties.

We had moved to a new farm and were very poor, the reason we went on the move was because Mother wanted us all to be near a High School. My older brothers and sisters were getting old enough to enter high school.

We did not have a car, so a kind neighbor offered to give us children a lift to Sunday School which we happily looked forward to each Sunday. I had a devout teacher and she taught us many things. She taught that we could pray and if we asked it with the right attitude we would get it.

During the following week, my father began to worry about the drought we were having. It had continued for weeks and everything was dry and turning yellow long before harvest. He said "If we do not have rain soon we will have nothing to eat, everything is drying up".

I listened and then ran to our old out house on the farm. Everything was dry! My bare feet kicked up the dust on the way.

Then in this old shelter I prayed to God to send rain if it be His will as near like the teacher had said as I had understood.

Then I started back to the house, before I reached the door almost without a cloud, possibly one "crack" of thunder, we had rain, a great rain.

I can still see how the hard rain hit the red dust, pattering and then making gullies in our front yard. I was amazed and thought all would be well now and my household would be happy.

As soon as the rain was over Papa went out to look things over and he said "that rain was too hard, it tore down everything"!

There were six of us children, we did not starve. I am 35 now.

- 2 Timothy 1:6 For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands.
- Are you utilizing your God given gift to revive the power of the Holy Spirit within you, and within those around you?

News and Announcements

- The United Methodist Conference is connectional. There are mission opportunities in our neighborhood, our state ... all over the world. If you have an interest, there is a need. Develop your vision. God does not want us to wander.
- · A little humor was shared from Proverbs 16:31 "Gray hair is a crown of glory; it is gained in a righteous life."
- · We had a service of Remembrance and Holy Communion on Friday night, recognized retiring clergy on Saturday afternoon and a service for the "Ordering of Ministry" on Saturday night.
- · There were lots of opportunities to sing your heart out and feel the Holy Spirit fill you to the brim!

"To God Be the Glory for the Things He Has Done." His blood saved me. His power raised me.

The business portion was not as inspiring as the speakers and preachers. It is sad to realize that church and state has been separated in the "public" world, however, all of the politics and policies of the world affect our churches. Most of the information can be found in the upcoming August Advocate. Many resolutions were discussed and accepted/passed. Delegates voted by ballot on the 5 Proposed Constitutional Amendments that were adopted by the delegates at General Conference in May 2016. These amendments have been/will be voted on by every conference around the world; however, results are not tallied by each individual conference so they could not be shared with us at this time. We learned details from the many speakers for and against these amendments.

Please pray for the delegates who will return to Oregon in 2019 to make monumental decisions as part of the "Commission on the Way Forward." The amendments cover gender equality, membership inclusion, delegate elections, bishop elections and bishop accountability. As a United Methodist, ask questions and seek answers. Tom Berlin, the lead pastor at Floris UMC in Herndon VA, has a blog with information and a video about discussions around these issues. (revtomberlin.com) We need to be informed and seek unity as a connectional church. Is the love of Jesus Christ sufficient to sustain that connection? The last time unity was not achieved was when the Methodist Episcopal Church split at General Conference in 1844 over the issue of slavery, although both sides claimed scriptural warrants for their claims. The questions we need to ask are is it wise and is it just? We must gain hearts of peace to release us to work in a world that is diverse and mission focused. Pray. Learn. Enter dialogue with curiosity. Pray. What is God's will?

If you can use anything Lord, you can use me. Take my hands Lord, and my feet Touch my heart Lord, speak to me.

Something to think about: The Great Wall of China was invaded 3 times by bribing the gate keepers! Stop the negative conversation. Just do God's mission. Do God's work. Do justice!

Everything I have written, I learned at the conference. I wrote this report from the notes I took. These are the thoughts of the speakers as I understood them. I heard a lot of information and inspiration! If you have any questions, I will be glad to try to answer them.
