

I listen to 91.3 Spirit FM while I drive in the Roanoke area. When I turned on the radio, they were going through their annual fundraising drive. As I am amazed to see them start so early, I also caution that people in our church will see our Stewardship Sunday in the same way.

When we

think about 'stewardship,' many consider it a

responsibility as members to contribute to funding that will help the church to operate. I do agree with the principle of us being responsible for the community of believers. However, I am certain that Biblical Stewardship goes beyond this.

Biblical Stewardship is our commitment to be faithful to our call as a follower. God called us to 'Love God and to Love others.' Through our commitment, we are renewing our call to love God with our heart, soul, mind and strength' (Mark 12:30-31).

1. Heart: Our commitment to living under the Biblical teaching of tithing is our commitment to be free of materialism. Jesus said we cannot serve two masters (Matthew 6:24). Tithing is the best antidote to be financially free.

2. Soul: Our commitment of our time with God, through worship and prayer is an essential part of our stewardship. Without a relationship with our Lord, all we seem to carry becomes a heavy burden. However, we remember that Jesus promises that his yoke is not heavy. (Matthew 11:30).

3. Mind: Stewardship means to fix our eyes onto our Lord, as we carry out the call. We are offering our lives, as a living sacrifice. We are not to be conformed to the world, but rather see how God renews our mind (Romans 12:1-2).

4. Strength: Our time to serve others and serve God's Kingdom is the final part of Biblical Stewardship. Not only is it a reflection of our love of others (Mark 12:31), but also it is a visual representation of us being faithful to the call to bless others (Genesis 12:3).

So, do not see Stewardship Sunday, on November 19th, 2017, as an attempt for our church to raise funds for the next year. It should be our renewed commitment, being offered as a thanksgiving to our Lord, to continue our journey as called people in this world. Reach Out Challenge 2017 is one expression. Our financial commitment to our Lord is another part of it. But most importantly offering our heart is the most important stewardship God asks from us.





The Story Behind the Song "I Have Decided to Follow Jesus"


This story is from the book *Why God, Why?* by Dr. Peramangalam Job. Dr. Job (1945-2012) was an internationally known evangelist. He has been called the "Billy Graham of India," preaching in 129 countries, sometimes to crowds of 500,000 people. He also became a global voice for persecuted Christians in Muslim and Communist nations. The story below speaks of faithfulness in the face of severe persecution, persecution which Dr. Job himself faced. Hindu militants in India failed in an attempt on Job's life in 1999, but in June of that year they killed his 21-year old son, Michael, by running him down with a car near the medical school where he was studying to become a doctor. Job died of a heart attack in August of 2012 while on a preaching mission in Hungary.

About 150 years ago, there was a great revival in Wales, England. As a result of this, many missionaries came from England to northeast India to spread the Gospel. The region was known as Assam and comprised hundreds of tribes. The tribal communities were quite primitive and aggressive. The tribesmen were also called head-hunters because of a social custom which required the male members of the community to collect as many heads as possible. A man's strength and ability to protect his wife was assessed by the number of heads he had collected. Therefore, a youth of marriageable age would try and collect as many heads as possible and hang them on the walls of his house. The more heads a man had, the more eligible he was considered. Into this hostile and aggressive community, came a group of Welsh missionaries spreading the message of love, peace, and hope of Jesus Christ. Naturally, they were not welcomed. One Welsh missionary finally succeeded in converting a man, his wife, and two children. This man's faith proved contagious and many villagers began to accept Christianity. Angry, the village chief summoned all the villagers. He then called the family who had first converted to renounce their faith in public or face execution. Moved by the Holy Spirit, the man sung his reply, "I have decided to follow Jesus. No turning back." Enraged at the refusal of the man, the chief ordered his archers to arrow down the two children. As both boys lay twitching on the floor, the chief asked, "Will you deny your faith? You have lost both your children. You will lose your wife too." But the man replied, again singing, "Though none go with me, still I will follow. No turning back." The chief was beside himself with fury and ordered the man's wife to be arrowed down. In a moment she joined her two children in death. Now the chief asked for the last time, "I will give you one more opportunity to deny your faith and live." In the face of death the man sung, "The cross before me, the world behind me. No turning back. No turning back." He was shot dead like the rest of his family.

But with their deaths, a miracle took place. The chief who had ordered the killings was moved by the faith of the man. He wondered, "Why should this man, his wife and two children die for a Man who lived in a far-away land on another continent some 2,000 years ago? There must be some supernatural power behind the family, and I too want that supernatural power." In a spontaneous confession of faith, he declared, "I too belong to Jesus Christ!" When the crowd heard this from the mouth of their chief, the whole village accepted Christ as their Lord and Savior.
