

It might be difficult for the children in a family that doesn't have the background of growing up in a church to sit in a worship service. Plus we might miss an opportunity to share the basics of worship and Christianity through an age-appropriate discipleship opportunity.

In response to this matter, the Next Generation Committee decided to embark on a new endeavor. They will start a monthly Children's Worship Service during our 11:00 AM Traditional worship on the first Sunday of each month. It will be a time for the children's ministry team to provide an age-appropriate worship service, which will teach our children the basics of worshipping God. This new Children's Worship service will start on February 4th, 2018.

Please continue to pray for the new Children's Worship starting in 2018, and also keep all the leadership of our Next Generation Committee in your prayers. We will commit to finding ways to include our children in our faith journey. As we continue to reach out to the Next Generation, may the Spirit be with us.

Her books' themes parallel UMW social initiatives. Ms. Macy presented overviews of her two books *Factory Man* and *Truevine*. *Factory Man* describes the impact of globalization on the citizens of Martinsville/Henry County who were employed in the furniture industries that were once headquartered in that area. *Truevine* tells the true story of two African American men with ties to the Roanoke area who were in the Ringling Brothers Circus sideshow in the first half of the twentieth century. These brothers were basically trafficked. Ms. Macy previewed her upcoming book which will be published in August, 2018. The book explores the opioid crisis that exists in our area of SW Virginia. Experiences of families impacted by this crisis will be related. The tea was well attended by church members and guests from our UMW district.
