






Ash Wednesday Service



Celebrating Our Love Through Communion

We celebrate the Lord's table, the first Sunday of each month. We call it the Lord's table because Christ has redefined the meaning of the rite of Passover, to remember Christ's sacrifice. Our participation in this meal rekindles our heart and soul to follow our Lord.

- **Thanksgiving:** We come to this table with Thanksgiving. Eucharist is another name for this sacrament. Eucharist comes from a Greek noun εχαριστία (eucharistia), meaning "thanksgiving." We come to the table with gratitude of the love of Jesus Christ, redeeming us from all iniquities. We also thank our Lord for God's hand to work in our lives. We come to the table with a heart of thanksgiving.
- **Companionship:** Jesus promised to be with us to the end of the world. However, many times, we lose sight of the presence of our Lord. Through communion, we remember the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, which continues to grow in our lives. The word communion comes from a Latin word '*communio*,' which means sharing in common. When the believers come around the table to partake in the Body and Blood of Jesus we commit to love one other through the mission of God.
- **Commitment to Service:** Christ sacrificed his life for the redemption of our souls. In the same way we partake of this holy sacrament by committing to live in a lifestyle following our Lord. We commit ourselves for service to the world. That is why the communion liturgy ends, by saying, "By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world," not only that we confirm our companionship with Christ and each other, but also we commit ourselves to be part of the ministry to the world.

There are many ways to commit ourselves to 'be part of the ministry to the world.' We can serve the world through our time, compassion, and many forms of service. On top of all the good service we provide to the world, let me introduce another opportunity to be part of this mission.

Recently, we have experienced a surge of people coming to our church seeking various types of assistance. We have just launched our 'Feed America' ministry, registering as a distribution center in the Roanoke area. However, there are times when people need financial assistance. The United Methodist Men heard our need, and donated \$500 to replenish our Church's Discretionary Fund. We want to extend this opportunity to the entire church by collecting a 'Love Offering' after the Lord's table, as an act of our Worship.

The Love Offering collected during each communion will be used specifically for the relief of our

neighbors and the world. We will make sure that all funds collected are designated for this purpose only.

Please join us as we revive this beautiful tradition of committing our service to the world.



As we gear up for many special events this Spring, now is a great time to join a musical group!

Here is what is happening in our Music Ministry.

Chancel Choir – In addition to singing regularly on Sunday mornings at our 11:00 service the Chancel Choir will be preparing a cantata for Good Friday, April 14th. The cantata will be accompanied by orchestra. If you can't commit to the choir on a weekly basis, but would like to sing for the Good Friday cantata please let Debra know so she can tell you which rehearsals to attend. We practice on Wednesdays at 7:30 – 9:00 and the group is open to adults and teens. Free childcare is available in our nursery during Chancel Choir rehearsals!



Children's Choir and Cherub Choir -. The children will be singing in church periodically throughout the Spring with the big highlights being our Easter service and our children's musical that will be presented on May 14th during the 11:00 service. The musical this year is "Table for Five...Thousand" which tells the story of the Miracle of the Loaves and Fishes. Not only do the children have fun preparing the musical and learning to sing and act, but they also learn valuable biblical lessons! The Children's Choir (for children in K-5th grade) rehearses on Wednesdays at 6:00—6:30 and the Cherub Choir (for preschoolers) rehearses during Sunday school on Sunday mornings.

JuBELLation – Our adult handbell choir will play in church many times this spring and will attend a bell festival in Clemmons, NC in April. Rehearsal is on Wednesdays at 6:30 – 7:30.

Bell Choir **Ringers For The Lord** – This handbell choir is for children in 2nd through 5th grade. We play in church once a month finishing with Easter. They are learning how to ring and read music. Rehears-

BELLievers – This handbell choir is for youth in grades 6 through 12. We will play in church about once a month finishing with Youth Sunday in May. We meet after the 11:00 service on Sundays, where we share a lunch together then practice. It is a great time to combine fellowship and making music together!

Youth Praise Band and First Light Praise Band - These groups provide music for our First Light service. We are in the process of hiring a new First Light Worship Leader, so we expect even more to be happening with these groups and this service in the spring. The youth praise band practices the last two Sundays of the month at 1:30, and the First Light Praise Band practices on Mondays at 6:30 PM. These groups welcome singers, guitarists, and other instrumentalists.

We will also have opportunities for instrumentalists to share their gifts with our church this spring through our orchestra for the Good Friday musical and our Brass Group on Easter. Please let Debra know if you play an instrument and would like to participate.
