



When God called Moses up to the mountain top, Exodus 24 16b says, "For six days the cloud covered the mountains, and on the seventh day the Lord called to Moses from within the cloud."

What does six days mean to us?

In many Bibles stories, I see that six days represents a time of preparation for God's will to be done.

In Genesis, we see how God created the world in six days and rested on the last. We can easily see the Sabbath as a time to rest, but we forget that God prepared and created the world to start a relationship with God's people on the seventh day.

In the story of Jericho, the Israelites were to circle the city of Jericho for six days. They might have thought to themselves, 'What in the world are we doing?' Without knowing that God was preparing them to see God's hand tumble down the walls of Jericho. The six days were to prepare the heart of the Israelites to witness God's hands working actively in their lives.

What if we see the season of Lent in the same way? We are to prepare our hearts for the greatest miracle of history; the resurrected Lord to come into our lives. What if we consider the six Sundays of Lent as the time to prepare our hearts to witness God's working hand in our lives? What if we invite family or friends to come and join our worship service, either in person or via our online service, and pray for God's hand to intervene in their lives? What would happen when our church is filled with stories of God's hand actively working in our lives? Wouldn't that be Good News being alive?






