We are a community of faith called to 'Love God, Love others, for the Transformation of the world.' To be faithful of our call, we are focusing our hearts to be 'idiots for our Lord.' We believe worship is a spiritual discipline helping us understand who we are and how we can live according to God's call. For the next couple of months, I'll be writing about worship, praying that it will help our understanding of worship. Please

let me know your thoughts and feedback about worship!

In the self-directed spirituality era where even Christians identify to 'I'm spiritual but not religious,' we see how church attendance is rapidly declining. According to Barna Research, only 35% of adult

Christians said they expressed their faith by attending a church service in the past seven days. Thom Rainer describes how church attendance behavior changed in the past couple of decades. Thirty years ago a regular church attendee would have been a person who attends three church services a week. Twenty years ago, a regular church attendee would have been a person who attends one church service a week. In the last decade it chanced to participate in worship once a month, and now it will be attending a worship service once every quarter.

There are many reasons why the frequency of worship declined, but the reality is astounding. I am not saying that we should cut all our extra activities to attend worship at Raleigh Court United Methodist Church,

Loving God Corporate Worship

but I want to challenge our spirituality to see how intentional we are to worship our Lord.

Christianity is not a solitary religion. We need to have a balance between having healthy personal worship and public worship. By focusing heavily on public worship, by no means are we disparaging the power of private worship. At the same time, we also have to understand that our personal

worship cannot substitute the impact we have by worshiping our Lord corporately, in public worship. I want to share a couple of reasons why corporate worship is a vital part of our journey of restoring Christ's image in our lives.

1 - Awakened by God's Revelation -

There was a college student who came and shared his story. He grew up in a family that taught him the beauty of personal devotions. Every morning, he would wake up and attend his heart to God's Word and how he should live as God's child. He shared how there will always be a question that lingers in his heart, to fully understand God's will. in his devotions. He continued to share that all those questions were answered through our Sunday worship. God reveals God's will, more clearly, when we come to God together in worship. John Wesley describes worship as an act of "looking upward and looking inward, in hearkening to the voice of God, and pouring out their hearts before him." When we pour our hearts to God in worship, God answers our prayers and thoughts in surprising ways.



The rate is \$10.00 per class or a class card may be purchased for a discounted rate of \$36.00 for four classes (to be used within two months).





2 - Encouraged by the word and presence - When we come to worship together, we are encouraged by each other, but also through the presence of God in our gathering. When we have worshipers filling up our Sanctuary, there is an exhilarating power of the presence. We see how we are not alone in this journey. We see opportunities to reach out and share our struggles, but also find ways to care for others. We experience how God grows us together in God's worship. When we come together, we see how 'Corporate worship leads to corporate discipleship.'

As I am sharing the importance of corporate worship, I do not want to do one thing; instill the guilt of God in our hearts. That was how we perceived worship. We felt guilty when we missed a Sunday. The church contributed to this phenomenon by teaching that God will not do good to people who did not do good to God. Coming to worship is not to validate our salvation, but it is the best way to help us to live out our salvation. When we come together, we will hear God's will clearly, continuing to grow with one another, and reach out to the world together.
