Loving God (4) - Worship in the Wesleyan Tradition - Pattern of Worship

The world consists and functions through a certain rhythm. There is a rhythm of a year; through the four seasons, we see how our life and activity changes. As spring approaches we know how the rhythm of the season changes our pattern and activities, as we clean up the winter mess. In the same way, our week has a certain rhythm. Through creation, God created the world and rested on the last day. For the new pattern to start again, God designated a day of Sabbath, for us to remember who we are and how we are called to live for God's mission. That is the reason why worship is so vital for us, as we enter into the new pattern of life.

There is a pattern of worship, which translates into a diverse and unified encounter with God and the Holy Spirit. In the Wesleyan Tradition, we call it the 'Pattern of Worship.' The Basic Pattern of Worship is not only the rhythm of our worship but also becomes a rhythm of life. The better we understand the rhythm of worship, the better we can understand how God is working and leading us in God's mission.

ENTRANCE/ GATHERING

We are entering into a Holy place and time to encounter our Lord. We come with praises, and we approach our Lord with troubles. We come from a busy world and need a time to 'gather' our scattered thoughts and spirit. That is why making

sure there is a time set aside to gather our hearts is a necessary discipline to prepare our hearts for worship. We praise the Lord together and also listen to others lead us in praise, as they share the unique experience of God touching their lives.

PROCLAMATION AND RESPONSE

We come to the word that is proclaimed. It is not the pastor's word, but what God is speaking to us through the shared words. God will speak to us, directly, when we have an opened heart and spirit to listen. That is why we humble our hearts to the Word, to hear what God says, not the person who delivers God's Words. Although, it never hurts to pray for the preacher. When the preacher humbles his/her heart to the Lord, we can all hear God's voice together.

The most important part of the proclaimed Word is our response. 'What is God speaking to me?' 'How can I live according to this Word' is the most important question we will have to wrestle with and answer throughout the week to come. That leads us to gather in worship, next week, and reflect and report how God worked in our lives throughout the week.

THANKSGIVING AND COMMUNION

Communion is a 'Means of Grace' reminding us how we are forgiven and how the Lord lives in us. On the Road to Emmaus, the disciples who encountered Jesus, had their eyes opened to the truth through
