

# Loving God (5) Worship vs. Service

At the same time, the gathering of believers is the reflection and proclamation of our love and submission to our Creator. er, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching" we see how important our worship is to the world.

Many Christians understand Sunday

Worship Service as a ticket to eternal life; whether it is true or false. I shared many times that I do not believe in a God who will reject us in God's Kingdom because we did not faithfully come to Sunday Worships. However, as a person, who is committed to keep the Sabbath holy by committing to worshiping God, I believe coming to a weekly service is crucial. It is crucial to our transformation. It is crucial to the mission of God. And it is crucial for the sake of others in this world. Since the world needs more of God's people, who are committed to gather to worship our Lord, and scatter to live out the service of our Lord to this world.



- Prayer Beads let children choose wooden beads and string, then decorate the beads with things they'd like to pray for. They can make a bracelet or a necklace or place it on their backpack.

### Church Plan for the Parsonage and Pastor's Housing

April 26, 2019

### **Background**

During 2018, our church parsonage was exposed several major flood events. Our Trustees assessed the damages to determine repairs needed, and compared the condition of the parsonage to the current standards for UMC Parsonages. From this assessment, the Trustees determined that:

- The basement level needed all new flooring and future sewage backups could only be prevented by installing a new backflow preventer.
- The parsonage would require substantial renovations to be marketable, costing at least \$10,000 in materials and another \$10,000 in contracted services (or donated labor by RCUMC members).
- The risk of future flood events would likely increase over time.
- Due to the Parsonage layout and construction, meeting UMC standards was not a viable option.

Accordingly, in early 2019, the Trustees voted to recommend the Executive Council approve sale of the parsonage. At the same time, the Staff-Parish Relations Committee had taken up the question of the parsonage condition independently. They reached similar conclusions as the Trustees, and further concluded that the Parsonage should be sold and replaced with a Housing Allowance.

#### **Current Status**

The Trustees made their recommendation at the regular Executive Council meeting on February 2019. After discussion by the Council, a Parsonage Task Force was commissioned to prepare an analysis and recommendations, addressing various issues relating to the Parsonage:

- If the Parsonage was sold, what would be the likely net proceeds?
- How would sale of the Parsonage impact the current pastor and family?
- What would be an appropriate amount for a Housing Allowance?
- How would a Pastor's Housing Allowance impact availability of future pastor appointments?
- How would a Housing Allowance impact the church budget short-term and long-term?

Proposing a funding plan for converting to a Housing Allowance.

The Task-Force was led by Rich McGimsey, and included representatives from the Trustees, Finance Committee and Staff-Parish Committee. The Task Force presented their findings and recommendations to the Executive Council on April 11, 2019:

- Sell the parsonage and convert to a Pastor's Housing Allowance at a rate of \$18,000 per year. An interested investor had been identified, who would buy the Parsonage for \$150,000 in its "as is" condition as soon as we have approval to sell.
- Impact on the current pastor & family: The pastor would need to arrange new housing and relocate from the current Parsonage. The pastor would be then be responsible for all maintenance, taxes and insurance. Pastor RJ has indicated that they would embrace this change.
- ◆ Funding the Housing Allowance The Task Force worked with the Trustees, Foundation and Finance & Staff-Parish Committees to address funding, since the proceeds of the Parsonage sale could not be directly used to fund the Housing Allowance. The plan developed would involve an endowment fund managed by the Foundation using a combination of proceeds from the Parsonage sale (approx. \$150,000) combined with \$300,00 of current Foundation assets. Annual returns from this endowment would support \$15,000 of the Housing Allowance, the remaining amount coming from savings to the budget from former Parsonage expenses. However, for the remainder of 2019 and some of 2020, additional fundraising will be required.
- Potential impact on future pastor appointments The Task Force found that use of a housing allowance is a growing trend and used successfully by many local congregations.

The Executive Council unanimously approved these recommendations at its April 11,2019 meeting.

### **Next Steps**

- There will be an <u>open "Listening Session" on May 5, 2019</u> at 4:00 PM in the Memorial Hall for the plan to be presented and address questions from the congregation.
- ◆ A <u>special Charge Conference will be held on May 20</u> at 5:30 PM, presided over by our District Superintendent, to take final action on the sale of the Parsonage. Upon approval of the sale by the Charge Conference, the district committee on facilities will then review the plan for final approval. At that time the sale of the parsonage can proceed.
